




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## Year in Review



### President's Message

Since its founding by visionary arts educator, the late Brother Joseph McNally in 1984, LASALLE College of the Arts has sought continually to surpass expectations, and to renew and reinvent itself. In the pursuit of academic excellence, the College has worked closely with its key partners including Singapore's Ministry of Education and Goldsmiths College to break new ground in arts education, and to pioneer new ideas, practices and programmes.

In doing so, the College reached new levels of distinction in the academic year 2016/17, and this Year in Review provides a glimpse of the many outstanding achievements of our students, staff and alumni. It also offers an insight into LASALLE's increasing influence and maturity, including the launch of Southeast Asia's first taught MA in Creative Writing and an innovative new interdisciplinary MA in Design. This year we also celebrated the tenth anniversary of our professionally accredited MA Art Therapy programme, now one of the most highly regarded in the world.

Among this year's numerous memorable events was **world-renowned designer Karim Rashid's inspiring Public Lecture;** two cutting-edge **Singapore Biennale 2016 Affiliate exhibitions**, the group show *The World Precedes the Eye* and *Boedi Widjaja's Black-Hut*; and performances celebrating the strong historic links between Ireland and Singapore, in partnership with the Ireland Funds Singapore. LASALLE's second collaboration with the **Singapore International Festival of the Arts** was an exceptional performance devised by our students and the legendary Bill T Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company, which brought much critical acclaim, and a tear to the eye.

Important new collaborations with industry and government organisations included WritersLab, in partnership with the Infocommunications Media Development Authority. This ten-week project supported eight budding local professional screenwriters to develop full TV scripts and series proposals, with tuition and mentorship provided by a renowned Hollywood writer and international experts. A number of the resulting scripts have already been picked up and are going into production.

The College continues to strengthen links and collaborations with some of the highest ranked arts universities in Asia, Europe, Australia and the United States. One example is the Global Design Initiative, co-initiated by Provost, Venka Purushothaman, which brings together globally oriented universities for regular symposia on the future of design practice. They include Central Saint Martins in London and Musashino Art University in Tokyo, which this year honoured Provost Venka with a prestigious university Fellowship.

LASALLE's continual aspiration to evolve and excel is also evident in a new academic structure. We have reduced the number of Faculties from five to three, creating eight new Schools within them: and introduced a new cross-institutional position of Dean of Teaching, Learning and Research. This has strengthened strategic leadership and operational efficiency across the institution, and expanded opportunities for cross-Faculty student collaborations and interdisciplinary projects. A newly modularised curriculum offers more flexibility for student overseas exchanges and internship opportunities, while a brand new Career Centre has enhanced career guidance and support.

Over the past five years, there have been significant year-on-year improvements in almost every aspect of the College's performance: from progressively high scores on annual student and staff satisfaction surveys, to increasingly strong employment statistics for recent graduates. For the first time this year, the College commissioned an independent survey and longitudinal study to track the longer-range employment outcomes of all our graduates, and the results are equally heartening. Alumni conveyed overwhelmingly that they are happy in their jobs, with 90% in employment, 4% in full-time study, and just 6% in between jobs - a remarkable result considering the freelance nature of many sectors of the creative industries.

At the same time, LASALLE has increased its number of SkillsFuture approved short courses for the public and continued to deepen community engagement. High profile community activities included a magnificent series of giant murals and projections on buildings during the third, and most spectacular iteration yet of the annual *ARTWALK Little India* project, in collaboration with Singapore Tourism Board and the Little India Shopkeepers and Heritage Association.

Equally moving and inspiring was our 30th Convocation, graced by guest-ofhonour Mr Ong Ye Kung, Minister for Education (Higher Education and Skills), with 790 proud students graduating. Some had picked up accolades at the Crowbar Awards including for Best of Show, Best of Advertising and Best of Design, while LASALLE won Institution of the Year for the third consecutive year. Other students won prestigious Red Dot Design Awards; MA student Ezzam Rahman won an NAC Young Artist Award: and alumnus Zai Kuning was announced as Singapore's representative at the 2017 Venice Biennale.

I am honoured to serve our students, alumni and staff, and am proud to report that this has been a year of remarkable events and achievements, where LASALLE's reputation has grown from strength to strength as one of Asia's most renowned and cutting-edge arts institutions.


#### The MA Creative Writing

is Singapore and Southeast Asia's first taught Master's degree of its kind. Students explore fiction, creative non-fiction, poetry, and dramatic writing within the vibrant and collaborative environment of LASALLE's full-fledged integrated arts campus.

The programme is led by Dr Darryl Whetter, an experienced educator who has taught writing at four different universities in Canada. He has published three books of fiction, two collections of poetry, and numerous essays and scholarly articles as well as nearly 90 professional book reviews. "At most schools, Creative Writing students and faculty are isolated from other campus artist-researchers or overshadowed by science and business programmes. At LASALLE, I get to teach writers at an institution devoted exclusively to the arts, and a wide range of arts, from visual arts to performing arts."





### Baby Tropical Lab

Baby Tropical Lab is a partnership between the Ministry of Education (MOE) and LASALLE, adapted from the annual Tropical Lab. Its objective is to cultivate young artistic minds and immerse themselves through a practiceled, out-of-the-classroom model.

This collaborative project between MOE and LASALLE College of the Arts is designed as part of the Art Elective Programme curriculum for students in local Junior Colleges.

In 2016, Baby Tropical Lab responded to

the theme of *Fictive Dreams*. 42 students and eight teachers from Hwa Chong Institution, Nanyang Junior College, and National Junior College delved into fictional worlds where dreams and nightmares probe our notions of reality.

The week-long programme culminated in an exhibition that ran from 19 to 27 November at LASALLE's McNally Campus.

### WritersLab: Taking Singapore <u>screenwriting</u> to the next level

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From January to March 2017, LASALLE partnered the Info-communications Media Development Authority (IMDA) to launch WritersLab, a first-of-its-kind intensive scriptwriting programme for Singapore writers. Part of the Story Lab initiative led by IMDA, WritersLab aimed to cultivate storytelling as a key capability in an evolving and competitive media landscape.

Eight experienced writers, including an award-winning children's author and a Mediacorp screenwriter, took part in the pilot edition. The rigorous 10-week programme was led by Project Director and Emmy-nominated writer, Shari Goodhartz, whose Hollywood credits include Star Trek: The Next

Generation, Disney's Raw Toonage, and the cult hit Aeon Flux.

Through WritersLab, participants sharpened their writing skills and received guidance from visiting international experts. The programme culminated with a pitching and networking session, where participants were able to pitch their completed scripts for production on Mediacorp's Toggle platform.



Regarded as one of the most prestigious competitions for young creatives across Asia-Pacific, attracting over 1,000 entries, our students are recognised as the best of the best.








PIPÉRINE and CRYSTALLINE, Red Dot Honorable Mention Jonathan Saphiro Salim, BA(Hons) Product Design






Now in its 37th edition, the award / scholarship programme has provided support to almost 700 students, some of whom have become leaders in the art world.

### The Winston Oh Award 2016: The Measure of Things


Highlights / Winston Oh

Inaugurated in 1999, the Winston Oh Award offers recipients the opportunity to develop their artistic practice and professional networks through overseas travel. Now in its 17th year, the award has enabled numerous students to immerse themselves physically and culturally in a country of their choice for a sustained period - an experience many find stimulating and transformative.

We speak with three of the 2016 award winners about their experiences abroad.

### Tinu Verghis, MA Fine Arts

Tinu spent her time in Iran training with traceuse, women parkour practitioners.





"Parkour, or 'the art of displacement', is a challenging urban sport which started in the 1980s and 1990s in the suburbs of Paris. There are more than 300 women in Iran who train Parkour, and I wanted to have my own experience of it. I wanted to learn how women in Iran mediate their body in the public space and join them in subverting the male gaze by attempting the art of displacement together.

When I was training Parkour in public spaces, I took off my head scarf, in response to the Iranian girls who were training without it. Islamic law in Iran states that women must cover their hair in public. Through this act, I experienced the full meaning of Foucault's comment that 'resistance is the necessary counterpart to power'.

This award has made it possible for me to do my research, and inspires me to keep developing meaningful artworks that deconstructs hegemonic narratives. LASALLE has expanded my mind, challenged me, helped me refine my skills and inspired me to take my art to the next level."

"The highlight was having witnessed the Chinlone Festival at the Mahamuni pagoda in Mandalay. Watching the teams play live and display their mastery and discipline was something special and unlike anything I've ever seen. I believe Chinlone can be a vehicle not only for changing the way we play sport but can also improve our human behaviour."

#### Moses Tan, BA(Hons) Fine Arts Moses travelled to China to trace how the distinct cultural contexts of China and Singapore shape the understanding and expression of shame in queer life.



"Winning the award was a great booster for me and gave me the chance to continue my practice for a short while after graduating without having to worry about concrete career plans.

In terms of research, one highlight was to meet Joelle from the Beijing LGBT centre, a safe haven for queer people in Beijing. Meeting a few individuals through Joelle, site visits and gaining access to texts which were only available in China added to my understanding of my own research focus and helped me streamline my research."


### Developing art practice abroad

Two lecturers from the McNally School of Fine Arts, Jeremy Sharma and Lim Bee Ling, had the opportunity to develop their practice abroad in 2016 as part of their professional learning and development at LASALLE.

#### Jeremy Sharma

Jeremy was the Stelva Artist in Residence in Desenzano del Garda, Italy, for two months from September to November 2016. During the residency, his research interests in form, materiality, and industrialisation were piqued by a visit to biotechnology company COPAN, makers of FLOQSwabs - a high-tech nylon swab which can be commonly found in pharmacies and clinics.



"They were very surprised to see an artist there! I asked them if they could give me over 3,000 FLOQSwabs to create an artwork. I created a 'swabscape': a sculptural landscape of specimens that I took from many sources, such as the lake, the soil, even the food in my rented apartment."

#### Lim Bee Ling

Bee Ling spent two weeks in Kyoto, Japan, learning the art of

*mokuhanga* – a traditional Japanese printmaking medium - from *mokuhanga* master Richard Steiner, who has been making prints for over 45 years in Japan. Over the two weeks, Bee Ling had the opportunity to meet other Japanese artists and printmakers, and was invited to exhibit her works in Gallery Hillgate, Kyoto, in February 2018.

### Transcultural Collaboration

LASALLE has signed a transcultural collaboration MOU with Zurich University of the Arts for a crossdisciplinary arts and design graduate programme, to foster discussion and understanding of globalisation and its emerging questions and issues.

This programme enables students to spend one semester in an immersive setting, based mainly in Hong Kong with stays in Zurich as well as opportunities to attend symposiums and field trips to other institutions.

Participating institutions include: City University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong Baptist University, China Academy of Art, Taipei National University of the Arts, and Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts.

#### McNally Fellowship Exchange with Trinity College Dublin

LASALLE Provost Venka Purushothaman spent one month at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland, as a Senior Research Fellow from 21 March to 20 April 2017. This Fellowship was made possible by the McNally Fellowship, established in 2015 to honour the College founder Brother Joseph McNally, and in celebration of the long-standing cultural ties between Singapore and Ireland.

### 2017 marks the 10th batch of graduating students from LASALLE's groundbreaking MA Art Therapy programme.

The programme was the first of its kind in Singapore and Southeast Asia. Today, LASALLE's MA Art Therapy graduates are making a difference all over the world, from art therapy in hospitals to disaster relief in stricken areas. \*Art therapy is increasingly becoming embraced and utilised as an acceptable mental health intervention and practice. Over the past several years, we have experienced an increase in invitations from the community to collaborate in large-scale projects, serve in consultancy roles and to develop art therapy services within agencies, hospitals and hospices.

In the future, I envision all major hospitals, rehabilitation centres, schools, hospices, and NGOs in Singapore to have a sustaining art therapy service fully integrated within their setting."





Headlining the festival with a lively dialogue on film writing was German writer and filmmaker Michael Schindhelm in conversation with Dr Darryl Whetter, Programme Leader, MA Creative Writing at LASALLE. The EUWF also tackled current topics such as reading and writing in the age of social media, challenges of art writing, and the fine art of publishing.

### Artist in Residence: Former Disney Animator Raul Garcia

Former Disney animator, Raul Garcia. was the Artist in Residence for BA(Hons) Animation Art from January to May 2017, where he taught regular classes and mentored students on their final year animation projects.

Raul's impressive list of animation credits include classics such as Who Framed Roger Rabbit, Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin, The Lion King, Hunchback of Notre Dame, Hercules, and Pocahontas. After Fantasia 2000, Raul joined Paramount Pictures where he worked on films like The Rugrats in Paris, The Wild Thornberries Movie and Jimmy Neutron: Boy Genius, which was nominated for a Best Animated Feature Oscar.

As director and producer, Raul helmed the animated feature Extraordinary Tales based on the stories of Edgar Allan Poe. One of the short pieces from the film, The Fall of the House of Usher. was shortlisted in 2012 for a Best Animated Short Film Oscar. In 2015. he was nominated as Best Director of a Feature Animated Film at the ANNIE Awards.


### Miracle Kutchie Experience Art Retreat Programme:

LASALLE, together with non-profit organisation Today is the Day Foundation and supported by the Singapore Red Cross, organised the third edition of Miracle Kutchie Experience: an art retreat programme for children from Hirono Town in Fukushima, Japan, who were affected by the 2011 earthquake and nuclear disaster.

For two weeks, 20 children aged 9-12 took part in art therapy sessions at LASALLE led by MA Art Therapy Programme Leader Ron Lay, facilitated by MA Art Therapy students and supported by therapists from Japan. The children also went on field trips and art-making sessions around Singapore, learning dry etching at the Singapore Tyler Print Institute, ceramics at Goodman Arts Centre and arts and crafts at the National Gallery Singapore's Keppel Centre, guided by Senior Fellow Milenko Prvacki.



### itsrainingraincoats raincoats for migrant workers

### Professor Steve Dixon & Prue Dixon <u>Things In Translation</u>

Professor Steve Dixon, president of LASALLE presented a joint exhibition entitled *Things in Translation: ...άθηρηλοιγός* with his artist wife Prue, whose work included cyanotypes and large screen-prints.

To mark Sungei Road flea market's closure in 2017, Professor Dixon presented 20 dioramas created from vintage figurines and toys that he bought from the market since stumbling upon it in 2012.

Professor Dixon has 2,000 figures in his collection from Sungei Road flea market, half of which were on display in the exhibition.

On the dioramas, he shared:

"I want to give new meaning through the way I present and combine figurines to create unexpected and dramatic scenes."

The exhibition invented languages and narratives to chart a journey where things become some things else, as they are carried across time, space and imagination.









According to a survey by 9 in 10 Nielsen, LASALLE alumni are employed, happy with their jobs, and find skills taught in college relevant at work.

The findings are based on a study of more than 700 former students who graduated between 1999 and 2014. In 2006, a year after graduating, BA(Hons) Design Communication alumnus Jayesh Sachdev took the plunge to leave his job in an advertising agency and start up his own business. From a salaried designer to a full-time practising artist and entrepreneur of a fashion label and design studio, his career path has been filled with ups and downs - but he has not looked back since. We speak to him on his career journey and how his education at LASALLE made a difference in his life.

"I often tell people that it may seem easy getting into LASALLE. but it was difficult to pull through - the College grills you for good reasons.

LASALLE was highly instrumental in shaping who I am as an artist. I graduated from BA(Hons) Design Communication in 2005. My education at LASALLE ensured that I have the creative skills to progress in my career, and with an enterprising spirit, I went back to India to set up my own design studio, Emblem. It was then when I started practicing as a full-time artist. A few years later, I successfully launched an art-based fashion label, Quirk Box, which incorporated art in fashion.

My studies have been relevant to my career - BA(Hons) Design Communication covers a wide scope of design practices that provided insights on how design can be used with multiple mediums. I have been conscientiously integrating what I learnt into my work for spatial design, fashion, graphics and fine arts.

The journey since has been nothing short of exciting. I am fortunate to have a progressive career graph and also to have achieved several national accolades, such as the national record for painting India's largest New Media artwork and the British Council Young Creative Arts Entrepreneur Award, to name a few."

# **Zai Kuning:** Singapore's representative at the <u>Venice</u> <u>Biennale 2017</u>


#### Alumni / Zai Kuning

Multidisciplinary artist Zai Kuning, a Fine Arts alumnus, represented Singapore at the 57th Venice Biennale. His installation *Dapunta Hyang: Transmission of Knowledge*, commissioned by the National Arts Council (NAC), is on display at the Singapore Pavilion until November 26, 2017.


**Dapunta Hyang: Transmission of Knowledge** uncovers forgotten stories of the orang laut, sea people of the Riau Archipelago. Central to the presentation is a 17-metre-long ship suspended across the length of the hall, and made only of rattan, string and beeswax.

As the first contemporary visual artist to resurrect Dapunta Hyang's story, Zai's journey is a culmination of over 20 years of research and discovery. The colossal ship is the fifth such vessel constructed by Zai, and the largest and most intricate to date. An earlier iteration, *The fleeting world of Dapunta Hyang*, was exhibited at LASALLE's Institute of Contemporary Arts Singapore in October 2014.





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### Overseas art residencies: Isabelle Desjeux

Alumni / Isabelle Desjeux

Fine Arts alumna Isabelle Desjeux was invited to participate in KENPOKU ART 2016, a new Biennale taking place in Ibaraki Prefecture in Japan. She shares her reflections on her experience with us.

"The KENPOKU ART festival was directed by Fumio Nanjo, Director of Mori Art Museum, Tokyo. It took place from 17 September to 20 November 2016, but I was first invited to visit and tour the area in February 2016.

I learned about the local culture, the inhabitants, and visited a few museums: art museums, but also some connected to the Hitachi mining company. Eventually, I was taken to an abandoned school which inspired me, and I asked whether this could be the site for my art. I chose to work in the Science classroom, which had a lot of experimental material. I also took over the kitchen classroom, the prep room and the greenhouse outside. When I came for another visit in June, I spent time with locals, visited the Tsukuba University, spoke to a local science teacher and ran a workshop for pre-school children. My art is connected with science and the acquirement of knowledge. In Ibaraki, I probed more deeply in the connections between folk tales, natural curiosity, and science as it is taught in middle school.

I was lucky enough to be invited by one of the locals to stay at her place during the installation, in September, so I had a truly immersive experience living in Ibaraki. Over the two months there, I created a total of 30 installations in the space,



ICA Singapore / Director's message

This year, LASALLE's Institute of Contemporary Arts Singapore presented six international and 18 LASALLE exhibitions, and published three catalogues. One of our key ambitions is to introduce to Singapore new curatorial thinking and changing critical attitudes in exhibition making: an international momentum that has been described as 'the curatorial turn'.

The academic year opened with an experimental exhibition that addressed this context and its parallel opportunities for learning head-on. Titled **Oceanic Feeling: Sriwhana Spong** and **Maria Taniguchi**, it was an unusual, open-plan installation that surveyed the art of two women artists from New Zealand and the Philippines respectively.

### The World Precedes the Eye

was an Affiliate Project of the 2016 Singapore Biennale and the second major international exhibition of the year. Using free-standing exhibition architecture as a curatorial counterpoint, and pursuing the concept that 'matter matters', it brought together artists from Hong Kong, China, Japan, Thailand, Turkey, Australia and Singapore. LASALLE's second Singapore Biennale Affiliate Project was Boedi Widjaja's **Black-Hut**, an ambitious architecture and sound project conceived specifically for the Earl Lu Gallery.

Other key curated exhibitions during 2016-17 include *A Room with a View*, presented as part of the Singapore International Photography Festival;

Suppose, There is A , curated by Singaporean artist Stephanie J Burt and featuring works by her artist-peers in Singapore and the United Kingdom;

Native Revisions, curated by ICA Singapore's Melanie Pocock, which presented photography and movingimage by exemplary artists, Chua Chye Teck, Noh Suntag, Anup Mathew Thomas and Tomoko Yoneda.

LASALLE exhibitions and public programmes provided opportunities for international peer-to-peer collaboration, professional development for alumni, and student engagement in curatorial work and practices of exhibition-making. Significant learning initiatives include dance students working on performances with New York-based artist Zou Zhao, distinguished German artist Markus Lüpertz's presentation to the McNally School of Fine Arts supported by the Goethe-Institut, and 10 internships and work placements undertaken by students from LASALLE and other tertiary institutions. With support from the College, ICA Singapore Exhibitions team leader Sufian Samsiyar was also able to travel to Venice as a member of the installation team for the Singapore Pavilion at the Venice Biennale.

Finally and significantly, the ICA Singapore embarked on a comprehensive collection inventory, documentation and cataloguing project in late 2016. Curatorial staff, student interns and a project assistant are undertaking a detailed review of the material culture and archives associated with the LASALLE College of the Arts Collection. There is a widely acknowledged need for focused, critical research and analysis of material culture in Southeast Asia. This extensive project will enable access to works of art for research by students and academics at LASALLE and beyond.



### The World Precedes the Eye


presented the work of nine international artists pursuing new thinking about matter in time, space and history. Spanning sculpture, installation, painting, moving image and sound, the works in the exhibition emphasised material as a finite resource, and the existence of material worlds beyond our current understanding. The exhibition utilised an opened-out architecture, drawing attention to the medium of curating and its mechanisms. Included were paintings Firenze Lai, found texts by Zeyno Pekünlü, a film by Shimura Nobuhiro, new 'thick' sculptures by Nabilah Nordin made from salvaged scrap, and spoken word by Zou Zhao exploring the human voice as sonic and cultural material.

Boedi Widjaja: Black-Hut An Affiliate Project of Singapore Biennale 2016 28 Oct 2016 - 1 Feb 2017

### Boedi Widjaja

Indonesia-born Singaporean artist designed an experimental architectural and sound work-a room within a room-that linked diverse conceptual references through his own lived experience of migration, culture and aesthetics. The room took the form of four dry walls that bisected the painted plasterboard walls and glass façade of the Earl Lu Gallery, creating a new focal point between its three existing columns. The walls were rendered with a pigmented concrete, salt and mica mix that changed as it cured over time. Widjaja's reference points included his childhood home in Surakarta (Solo) and the 'black box turned insideout' architecture of the LASALLE McNally campus.

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Native Revisions presented photography and moving image by four artists from Asia who have returned to particular locations over a number of years. The locations in the artists' works include forests in Singapore, a village in South Korea neighboured by a United States military base, communities in Kerala, India, and significant sites of World War II in Japan. The works provide various viewpoints of these locations. Visual 'clues', titles and accompanying texts referenced the cultural and political contexts that have shaped these places. Major works in the exhibition included an 18 metrewide curtain by Anup Mathew Thomas, and a three-channel video installation by Tomoko Yoneda that presented unfolding views of the Northern Lights, a public square in the island of Sakhalin, Russia, and a road in Kilpisjärvi, Finland, at night.

Sriwhana Spong and Maria Taniguchi: Oceanic Feeling was the first major survey of New Zealand artist Sriwhana Spong and Filipina artist Maria Taniquchi's decadelong practices. The exhibition reflected on the artists' concerns with material. technological and natural processes, through sculpture, painting, film and video, and performance. The open format of the exhibition highlighted the scale of Gallery 1 and the works. It included major paintings from Maria Taniguchi's acclaimed 'brick' series, a new suspended silk work dyed in Coca-Cola and grape Fanta by Sriwhana Spong, and a performance by Spong in collaboration with Vivian Wang, musician and member of Singaporean avant rock outfit The Observatory.




**EËJA** was an installation by Fiona Koh that explored the mediation and design of typical office furniture. Presented in the form of a showroom, it featured furniture and furnishings that opposed their original function: a desk without workspace, shelving units made of EVA foam and dysfunctional lighting. The installation also included posters of designs for other items of what Koh describes as 'futile furniture' that manipulate the typography and branding of Scandinavian furniture chain IKEA.

Fiona Koh is a member of art collective Vertical Submarine, and an alumna of the Diploma in Design Communication Programme (2003 cohort) at LASALLE College of the Arts. **EËJA** was her first solo exhibition.

Whitewash was an installation by MA Fine Arts graduate (2015 cohort) Warren Khong that interacted with the unusual, light-filled architecture of the ICA Singapore's Praxis Space. In the work, Khong transformed the gallery into a seamless white space. The installation highlighted the white walls of the gallery and challenged the status of whitewash as a 'base layer' by emphasising it as an important physical element. Khong figuratively and literally whitewashed the gallery, displacing its surface with white material. A new structure replicated an existing element in the gallery, and invited visitors to focus on the aesthetic characteristics of the space.
