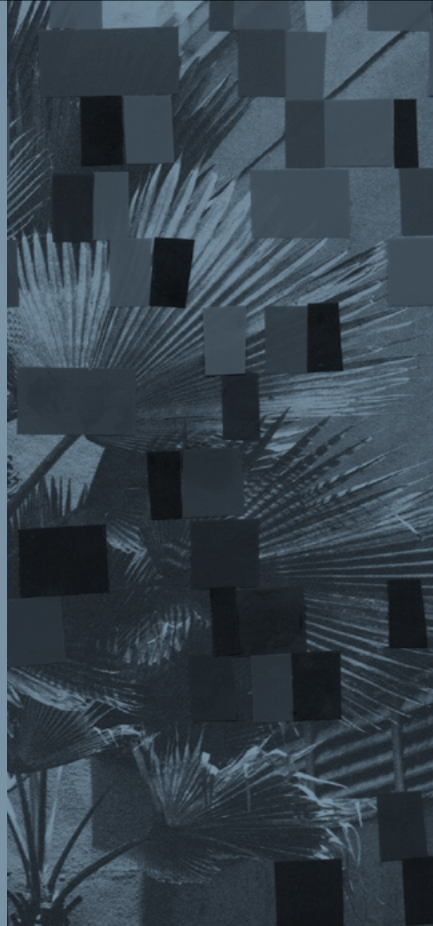

Campuses

McNally Campus

Situated in the central civic and cultural district of Singapore, the McNally Campus is designed to optimise interaction and provide line of sight across the community through its glass facade and gateless walls. The design provides many platforms for interaction and inspiration. In keeping with the integrative nature of contemporary arts and design practice, multiple breakout spaces and sky bridges encourage diverse art forms to coalesce and co-mingle, providing an inspiring learning environment for students.

Architecturally iconic and designed to enable a vibrant, connected community, the McNally Campus offers students an impressive array of performance and exhibition spaces for learning and showcasing. Core lectures and teaching programmes take place at the McNally Campus where LASALLE's unique learning environment encourages interdisciplinary interaction and a holistic approach to contemporary practice.

Winstedt Campus

The Winstedt Campus supports continuous innovation and excellence by supporting studio-based work and research. The space is designed as a comprehensive creative centre that visual arts students—in particular those involved in studio-based modules and levels—can utilise ample and appropriate spaces to develop and complete their semester projects, especially when some of these works might be larger in scale and ambition.

Wilkie Edge learning space

Located just 50 metres away from the McNally Campus, the Wilkie Edge learning space is used for studio-based modules and research work of the Faculty of Design. It also features a communal space for MA student-initiated events.





The Ngee Ann Kongsi Library

The Ngee Ann Kongsi Library houses an extensive arts-related specialist collection of Singapore publications in hard and electronic forms including:

- A comprehensive range of arts and design books, audio-visual resources, e-books and periodicals with a focus on building a niche collection in the contemporary arts.
- A Singapore collection of local artists and the arts scene.
- A contemporary Asian art collection.
- Exhibition catalogues of local and foreign artists.
- Academic databases and e-journals, specialist art dictionaries, encyclopaedia and directories.
- Audio-visual materials including music CDs, CD-ROMs, videos, DVD and Blu-ray DVDs.



LASALLE's Institute of Contemporary Arts Singapore

The Institute of Contemporary Arts Singapore (ICAS) is the curatorial division of LASALLE College of the Arts. Situated at the College's dynamic city campus, its five galleries present a programme of curated international exhibitions alongside exhibitions organised with students, academic staff and alumni. ICAS provides curatorial expertise and resources in the areas of exhibition development, display and mediation, publishing and education as well as manages the LASALLE College of the Arts Collection.

Theatres

For teaching and learning purposes, LASALLE houses the Singapore Airlines Theatre and two other black boxes. These spaces are also popular with external hirers to stage major theatre festivals and performances during semester breaks.



Alumni

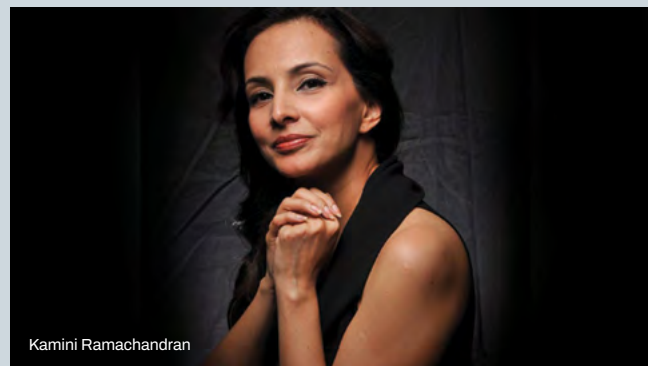

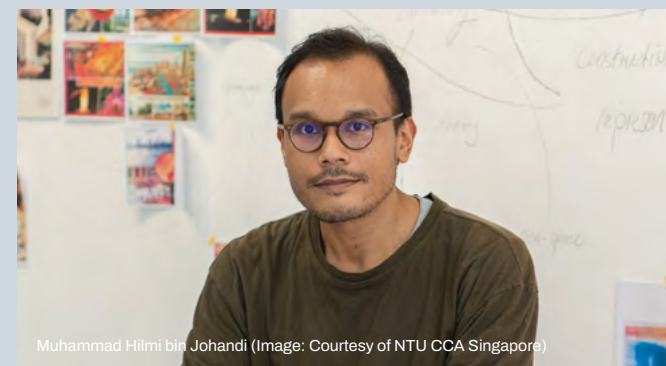

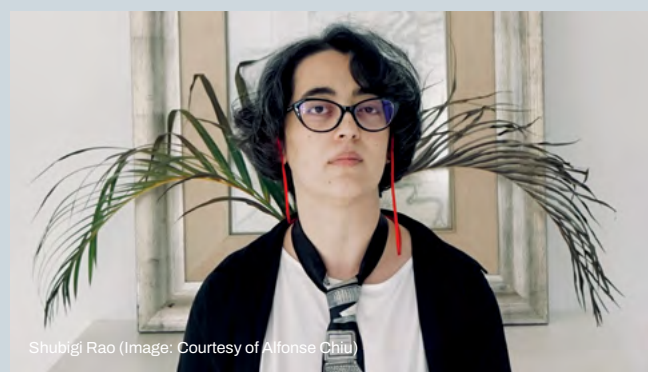

MA Arts and Ecology

Establish your artistic voice on ecological issues of our time.

This studio-based programme is located in one of the greenest cities in the world, Singapore. This is a unique and pioneering transdisciplinary programme in Asia for creative practitioners, ecologists and researchers, and for those who seek to explore critical environmental discourses, address questions around ecological crisis and build sustainable environments through art and creative practices.

It grounds itself in rigorous artistic research with a profound understanding of ecological concerns that you have. You will study real-world concerns and conditions through collaborative and field-based research and creative practice. The programme aims to develop your critical unpacking of ecological discourse through a range of modules such as Critical Discourse in Arts and Ecology, Eco Studio and Social Studio through lectures, workshops, scientific and intellectual inquiry, and community engagement.

You will be encouraged to engage with the diverse cross-fertilisation of contemporary creative and expressive practices, and be supported in establishing partnerships with stakeholders and engagement with community, business and enterprise as relevant to your practice.

Graduates are independent thinkers, creative practitioners and solution-oriented individuals who want to make a difference to the earth.

- **Forward-looking learning environment:** Be a pioneering eco-arts professional at Singapore's first and only arts university that supports Singapore's Green Plan 2030 and aims to foster responsible creative global citizens.
- **Practice-led laboratory approach:** The programme is designed to foster laboratory, student-centred learning that encourages collaborative, community-driven, field-based research and art-making.

- Academic, creative, and/or professional writing relevant to your research interests for this degree, clearly labelled and presented in PDF format.
- Artworks documented in digital format. Artworks, such as drawings, installations, paintings and sculptures, should be in high resolution with selected images with close up viewing of details. Interdisciplinary time-based works or performance and awareness e-based works should be presented in video format. You may also include photo-documentation of your artworks in an exhibition setting.
- Site-specific ecologically-centred projects in public or private space, clearly labelled and documented in digital format.

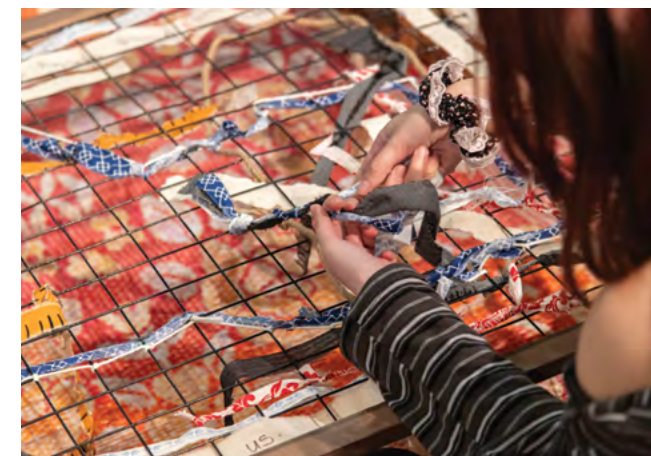

MA Asian Art Histories

Read history, make history.

The MA in Asian Art Histories programme cultivates a new generation of art historians, curators, art writers and exhibition-makers. It is a global pioneer to focus on Asian modern and contemporary art histories.

It nurtures a nuanced and impactful appreciation of art from Asia, attracting a diverse and rich community of learners and scholars who seek to make a difference in their respective fields, countries and art.

Located within the McNally School of Fine Arts, the programme provides you a rare opportunity to work alongside and engage with emerging and established artists, field experts, curators and collectors drawn from Singapore and Asia's rich visual arts ecology. You will also be oriented to critically engage with the wide range of exhibitions presented by LASALLE's Institute of Contemporary Arts Singapore.

Singapore's strategic geographic and culturally connected position in Asia and its investment in arts infrastructure have created numerous opportunities for our students to connect globally and engage with contemporary art discourse. The programme plugs centrally into this development, providing you with sustainable career opportunities.

You will be provided with appropriate research, art historical and theoretical knowledge and resources, and the opportunity to undertake original research in largely under-explored fields, investigate and amplify emerging artists and movements, and contribute to art historical discourse and scholarship.

The programme also encourages you to establish and expand your professional practices and networks to hone your potential to become a leading thinker and cultural producer in your field. Its rigour will adequately prepare you to pursue PhD studies in art history.

This unique research-based programme for artists fosters a deep inquiry into artistic practices through research. It supports artists to develop a profound conceptual and aesthetic approach to their practice and achieve a level of professional excellence required by the demands of a dynamic contemporary art landscape.

The programme's core concerns in contemporary art-making attract a diverse body of students who cross disciplines and geographies. In a multidisciplinary peer learning environment, you are supported to build your artistic vocabulary by pursuing high-level independent research as required for professional arts residencies, archival and fieldwork and PhD study. Through rigorous studio experimentation and innovation, you engage with emerging critical, theoretical and historical discourses to develop your practice.

Singapore's strategic geographic and culturally connected position in Asia and its investment in arts infrastructure have created numerous opportunities for artists to connect globally and engage with contemporary art discourse. 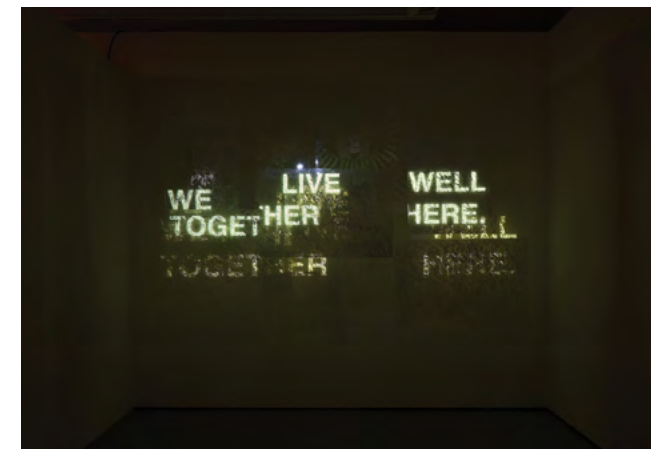

A first of its kind in Southeast Asia, it develops credentialed art therapists who help people effect change and growth through art materials in a supported and safe environment. Drawing on a range of world-class medical and mental health options available in Singapore, this practice-based clinical programme emphasises experiential learning through art-making, reflection and research.

Aligned to national mental health mandates and informed by international best practices, the programme is Australian, New Zealand and Asian Creative Arts Therapies Association (ANZACATA) approved, preparing you to become a professionally credentialed Registered Art Therapist (AThR).

The MA in Arts Pedagogy and Practice is the only programme in Asia dedicated to artist-educators. Designed for artists working in educational environments, the programme unlocks conventional pedagogic principles for the arts and introduces, through experimentation, inter- and transdisciplinary modalities in which new learnings emerge.

The programme delves into educational theories, curriculum design, content delivery and assessment strategies appropriate for artists, practitioners and arts educators. 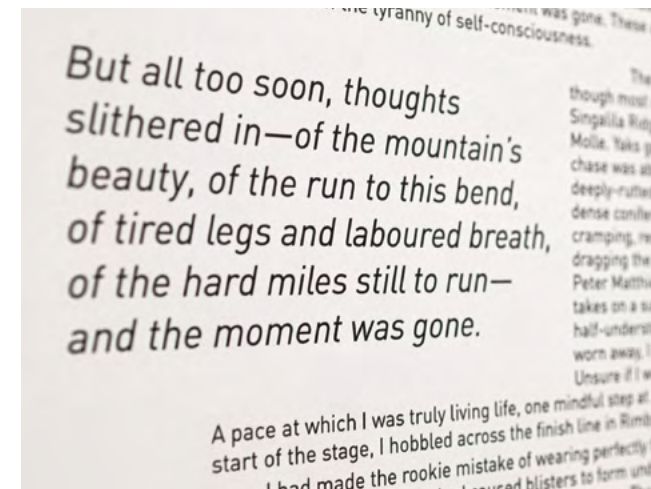

MA Music Therapy

Become a qualified music therapist and use your musical skills to improve people's well-being.

The MA Music Therapy programme is delivered within a robust framework of musical aesthetic excellence, well-evidenced theories and rigorous clinical practice training that is informed by professional ethics, guidelines and best practices. It is the only such programme in Singapore.

You will contribute to the health, wellness and well-being of people across the lifespan of your practice that is deeply rooted in cultural contexts, including those encountered in Singapore and across the region.

The profession of music therapy is the scientifically informed use of music interventions within a therapeutic relationship that aims to provide functional, educational, rehabilitative or well-being outcomes. Music therapists have a deeply rooted identity as musicians. With education/training, this relationship with music finds new meanings in the application of musical skills, aesthetic mastery and therapeutic competencies within health-giving and health-maintaining contexts.

The practice involves working in therapeutic public health settings such as acute hospitals, community hospitals, hospices, mental health institutions, nursing homes, group homes, community centres and NGOs, as well as providing consultations and care in private practices.

Music therapists provide therapeutic services across all age-groups ranging from infants to children and adolescents, adults, and older adults (including those living with dementia). These services may be offered in such settings and contexts as paediatric units, education environments, medical facilities, and specialised care facilities including purpose-built palliative units and hospices.

Credentialed music therapists such as graduates from this programme are governed under a strict code of ethics and professional standards to ensure a high level of integrity in their practice with children and vulnerable adults.

Portfolio

Your portfolio should contain relevant and substantial creative work in either written or visual form. You may include projects (including sketches, process, experiments, and iterations) and visual documents to reflect your research interest(s) and provide evidence of sufficient technical skills and evolved critical and creative thinking in design.

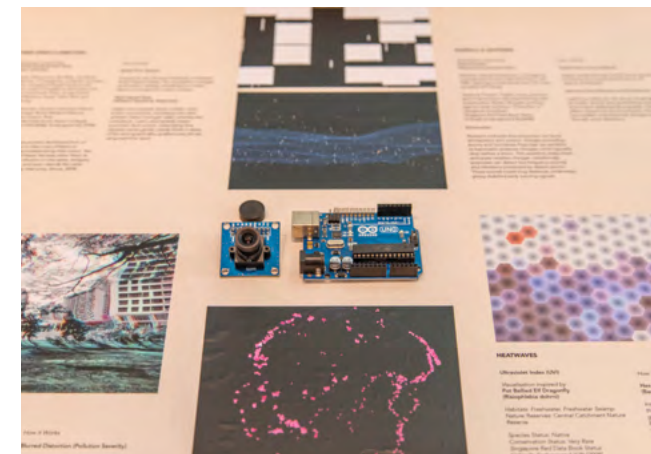
Each piece of work should be labelled to indicate if it is academic, professional or personal. If you present a team project, clearly identify your individual contribution. Keep any description to a minimum number of words. Upload your portfolio as a PDF file of not more than 120MB.

Notes:

- Although AI has revolutionised the world of art and design, we prefer to see work that has not been assisted with AI tools.
- All submitted materials should be original works created by you.
- Portfolios containing work copied from other sources, such as websites, magazines, films and the work of other artists/designers, will be rejected.
- Examples of work might include designing a brand identity, packaging, fashion design, surface and textiles patterns, furniture, products, spatial design, posters, advertisements, storyboards and mood boards.

Interview

Shortlisted applicants will attend an online interview. During the interview, you are required to participate in a dialogue regarding the purpose of your application. Please be prepared to talk about the research interests that you wish to explore, your background, what inspires you and your influences. We would like to find out what motivates you to learn, explore and experiment in your areas of interest. You should also share how you think the programme will benefit you in your future career choices or develop your research interests.

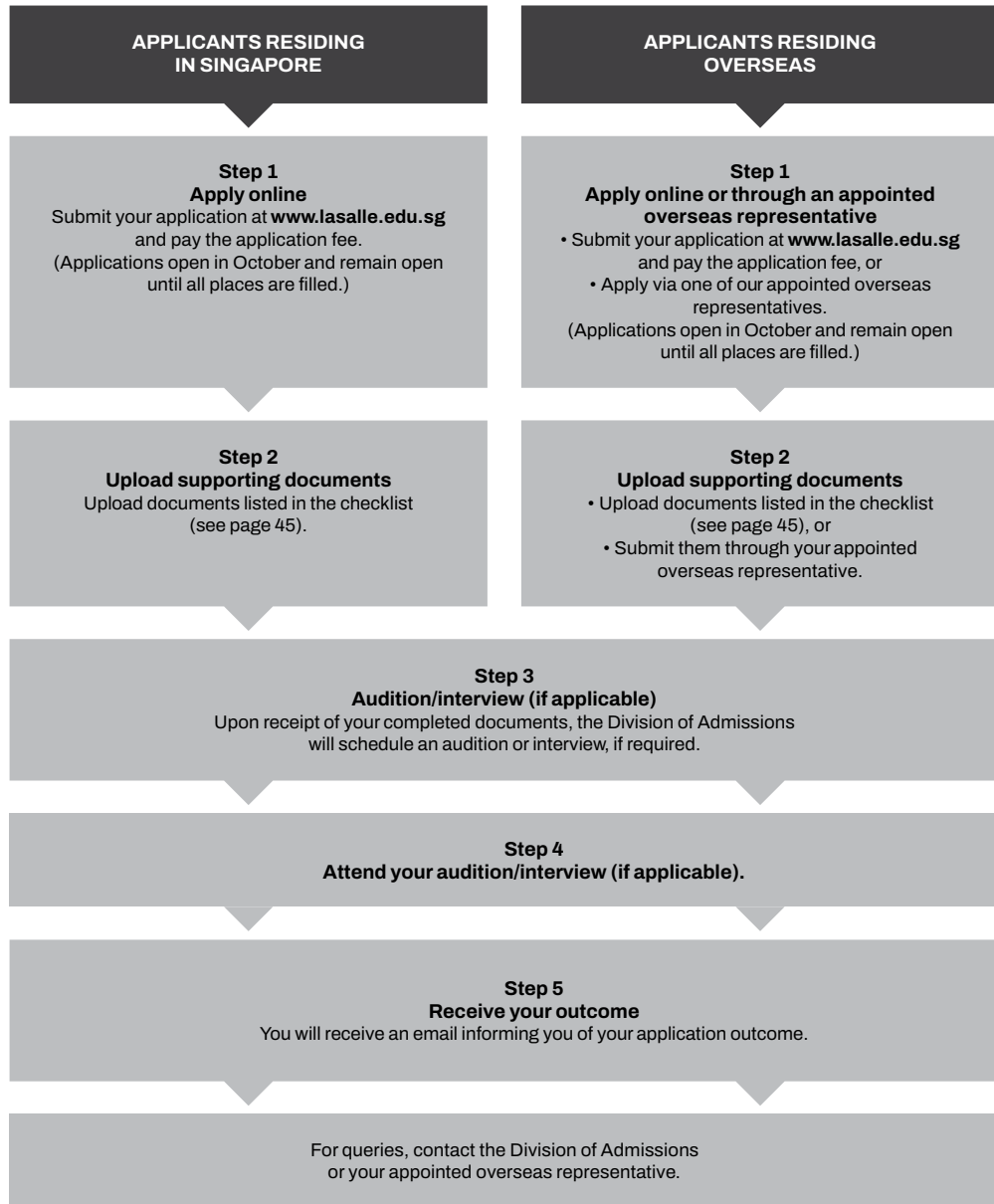

Refund policy

Refund for withdrawal due to non-delivery of course

The College will notify the student within three (3) working days upon knowledge of any of the following:

1. It does not commence the course on the course commencement date.
2. It terminates the course before the course commencement date.
3. It does not complete the course by the course completion date.
4. It terminates the course before the course completion date.
5. The student, when given a conditional offer, failed to meet the programme entry requirement.
6. The Student's Pass application is rejected by Immigration and Checkpoints Authority (ICA).

The student should be informed in writing of alternative study arrangements (if any), and also be entitled to a refund of the entire course fees and miscellaneous fees already paid should the student decide to withdraw, within seven (7) working days of the above notice.

Refund for withdrawal due to other reasons

If the student withdraws from the course for any reason other than those stated above, the College will, within seven (7) working days of receiving the student's written notice of withdrawal, refund to the student an amount based on the refund table.

Refund during cooling-off period

The College will provide the student with a cooling-off period of ten (10) working days after the date that the contract has been signed by both parties. The student will be refunded 100% (stated in the refund table) of the fees already paid if the student submits a written notice of withdrawal to the College within the cooling-off period, regardless of whether the student has started the course or not.
