Ibu susah payah kerja dua tugas bakar sikap bermalasan

ENCIK Luqman Nurhakim Abdul Gafor adalah pelajar yang kurang bermotivasi ketika mengambil kursus penerbitan audio dan video digital di Institut Pendidikan Teknikal (ITE) Kolej Barat, beberapa tahun lalu.

Namun, sejaknya menjalani Perkhidmatan Negara (NS), terbetul di fikiran tentang pengorbanan ibunya, Cik Sapiah Nek, demi menyerah persekolahannya.

Hingga ke hari ini, Cik Sapiah masih menjalankan dua tugas sekali gus sebagai kakitangan jabatan perkesan di Hospital Universiti Nasional (NUH) dan pekerja sambulan restoran makanan segera McDonald's.

Sekarang, adik Encik Luqman, kini 26 tahun,

dengan kerja keras ibu yang ingin melihatnya berjaya dalam pelajaran, kerja dan kehidupan.

Sejak itu, anak bongsu dalam dua beradik itu turut belajar tidak lagi sia-sia-kat peluang melanjutkan pengajian peringkat diploma dan ijazah di Maktab Seni Lasalle.

Setelah meraih Diploma Media Penyiaran, Encik Luqman sebagaimana penerima ijazah Kepujian Kelas Pertama dalam bidang perfileman pula, kolmarin.

Encik Luqman meraih ijazahnya di sesi konvoikesyen yang berlangsung di Dewan 3, Pusat Persidangan dan Pameran Singapore Expo.

Tetamu terhormat bagi majlis itu adalah Menteri Perdagangan dan Perusahaan, Enik Chun Sing.

Ketika ditemui *Gah!* di Lasalle, baru-baru ini, Encik Luqman berkata:

"Awalnya, saya menyimpan hasrat ke politeknik. Namun, selepas dapat keputusan Sijil Am Pelajaran (GCE) Peringkat 'N', saya terus ke ITE."

"Beberapa guru sekolah menengah saya kecewa dengan keputusan yang diambil.

"Saya pulak masih bermalasan ketika di ITE. Payah bagi saya mencari semangat positif ketika itu."

"Mujurlah, sewaktu NS, saya terfikir tidak wajar saiz-saizan masa dan pelanggahan ibu susah payah bekerja di hospital dan restoran makanan segera.

"Saya perlu membalsas jasanya dengan pastikan tumpuan diberi pada bidang pengajian.

"Selama lima tahun di Lasalle, iaiti tiga tahun di peringkat diploma dan dua tahun bagi pengajian ijazah, saya tidak leka atau buang masa.

"Kos pengajian di institusi seni juga melancarkan banyak. Mujur, saya juga diberi duit tunai Mendak."

"Masih manis penat pun menyiapkan pelbagai projek, saya tidak mudah berputus asa atau membiarkan 'semangat seminit' menguras diri saya," ujarnya.

Bagi tahun akhirnya, Encik Luqman dan beberapa rakan sekuarsus perlu menyampaikan dua projek filem iaitu sebuah filem ringkas dan sebuah dokumentari.

Keduduan keluar dari zon selesa malah menyentuh perihal larangan yang disorok makar.

Hiding Birds adalah filem ringkas tentang homoseksualiti. *Pre-Loved* pula dokumentari yang membuktikan kisah gadis yang sanggup menjual pakaian dalamannya untuk merahwah lumayan.

"Banyak cabaran yang dihadapi sebagai penyanyi dan kedua-dua filem ini."

"Dalam keadaan lunga selesa, saya perlu pastikan pencetakan sampai ada unsur simbolisme yang digunakan dan kesimbangan diraih agar penonton juga mampu menghadam jalan cerita."

"Komunikasi juga perlu. Bayangan selepas penantian menyentuh filem ini, si pengarah ingin mengubahnya mengikut keperluan peribiti," tambah Encik Luqman.

Sejak tiga bulan lalu, beliau gigih menimba ilmu ospesialisasi menerusi tugas suntingan video di syarikat khidmat media antara-bangsa, TVT Media.

"Filem berperanan menyampaikan kisah yang boleh mencecah inspirasi atau membawa gerak langkah positif dalam diri seseorang."

"Perjalanan panjang saya dari ITE ke Lasalle sendiri mendewaskan. Yang penting, cari minat anda dan jangan putus asa," pesan beliau lagi.

MEMANDANGKAN mereka sama-sama pelajar matang yang telah melalui aliansi pekerjaan, Encik Muhammad Masruzi Mazlan dan Cik Irmawati Tubi saling sokong-menyokong di Maktab Seni Lasalle.

Dua sahabat karib ini bahkan menitip diri pengajian kursus ijazah seni halus mereka dengan Kepujian Kelas Pertama, kelmanin.

Encik Muhammad Masruzi, 27 tahun, bekas pegawai khidmat pekerja di hospital tempatan, berkata:

"Saya amat gembira dan bersyukur bahawa setelah melalui onak duri dalam kehidupan, akhirnya saya meraih kejayaan dalam bidang seni halus yang saya minati tetapi tidak dalam sebelum ini."

"Semua berdoa orang-orang keliling termasuk guru yang saya hormati dan berasa bahagia bersamanya."

"Irmawati dan saya pula berkorang prinsip sama. Walau kami jauh lebih dewasa daripada pelajar lain, kami yakin pembelajaran kita buat sepanjang hayat."

"Ia merupakan satu ibadah yang memerlukan pengorbanan."

Pemuda dengan daya humor serta sopan tutur kata itu meraih banyak peluang keemasan menghasilkan arca menarik atau seni persembahan di samping peluang mengembarga ke Jepun sepanjang di LASALLE.

Banyak amegurb seperti Anugerah Belia Hanpan Ghak Chok Tong, Anugerah Seni Amegurbang Takfui dari Jepun dan Anugerah Kembara Winston Oh juga dimenangi kerana kerja seni cemerlang.

Menyentuh tentang Anugerah Kembara Winston Oh berupaya bagai menjalankan kajian seni di luar negara, belum lagi ingin menarik pengunjung ke peringkat sarjana berkata.

"Seketika mengikuti saya ke Singapura, saya sampaikan seni persembahan yang saya buat sebelumnya secara online dalam video."

"Terus yang cuba saya sampaikan, kalau kita mahukan sesuatu, jangan berharap sahaja tanpa bekerja keras."

Cik Irmawati, 36 tahun, seorang guru seni lukis di Sekolah Menengah Fuhua pula akhir dirinya sudah lama ingin memburu ijazah seni halus sejak tamat pengajian diploma di Akademi Seni Habs Nanyang (Nafa), sekitar 15 tahun lalu.

Sebelum bergelar guru, beliau pernah bekerja sebagai pengurus kesatuan pelajar dan wewasas berkeperluan khas di Pergerakan Ulama Golongan Kurang Daya Upaya Intelek (Minds).

Beliau membimbing masyarakat agar mampu menyusutkan diri dengan masyarakat sekelilingnya.

"Setelah sekian lama meninggalkan dewan kuliah sebagai pelajar, saya perlu menyusutkan diri saya dengan amalan belajar semula."

"Namun, saya selalu berikan yang terbaik bahkan menjalankan projek sepadan sepadan, sama ada mengenai kekangan perburuhan atau dilulusi menerima di hospital atau penyalur kultit yang pernah saya sendiri hidapi."

"Saya bahkan yakini setiap kerja seni boleh dijadikan sandaran dan renungan dalam mendidik masyarakat," ujarnya lagi.

SEPERTI remaja lain, Cik Nurul Huda Roahain juga pernah mengalami masalah semasa di peringkat sekolah menengah.

Namun, semua masalah remajanya itu tidak terba-bawa sehingga beliau dewasa.

Selainnya, sejak yang dialaminya dijadikan pengajaran dalam Industri Fesyen, dia berjaya mengatasi masalah ini.

"Ahang silihun saya memberitahu saya bahawa mereka sebelum melanjutkan kursus ke universiti punya

"Ahang silihun saya merupakan tahun paling "teruk" buat saya kerana ia merupakan tahun paling "teruk" buat saya kerak."

"Ternyata amaraninya itu membantu saya."

"Saya juga buat kesilapan seperti remaja lain, tetapi saya sentiasa beri masa untuk mengimbang kesilapan saya itu," katanya, yang kini berusia 23 tahun.

Mujur baginya juga bawa mendapat sokongan padu daripada ibunya, Cik Faridah Mohamed Hussain, 66 tahun, seorang ibu tunggal dan bekerja sebagai ejen hartanah.

Kemudian Cik Nurul Huda bawa terserah tatkala be-liau, anak bongsu tiga beradik, melangkah masuk ke Maktab Seni Lasalle.

Hasnilnya, bekas penuntut jurusan Media dan Industri Fesyen dengan keutamaan dalam Industri Fesyen itu meraih ijazah Sarjana Muda (Kepujian) Kelas Pertama selepas tiga tahun mengikuti kursus tersebut.

Menurutnya, minatnya terhadap subjek yang berkaitan pemerasaran dan penjenamaan, selain mempunyai penyayang yang hebat, menjadi faktor pendorong buatnya.

"Dalam tahun kedua, pensyarah saya itu membimbing saya untuk memilih jurusan Industri Fesyen sebagai subjek utama selepas melihat kekuatan saya terletak pada perkiraan pemragaan kursus tersebut."

"Memang saya tidak menyelsa memilihnya."

"Saya fikir subjek-subjek tersebut menarik perhatian saya memandangkan saya dapat lihat idea saya "dihidupkan" dan saya dapat hasilkan kaedah kreatif dan menarik untuk mengatasi masalah," kata bekas penuntut Politeknik Temasek (PT) itu lagi.

Beliau kini pekerja pelatih bahagian penerbitan kandungan dan kreatif di sebuah syarikat.

Justeru, apakah nasihat beliau kepada golongan muda?

"Saya fikir nasihat terbaik adalah mengimbang setiap masalah yang dihadapi dan lihat masalah dari sisi sudut lain agar kita meletakkan diri dari orang lain untuk kita memahami mereka," jelasnya.

Pelajar dewasa di Dubai terkejut cemerlang di bidang reka hias dalaman

KEPUTUSAN tahun pertama Cik Muafah Amran semasa mengikuti kursus ijazah Kepujian dalam Reka Hias Dalaman di Maktab Seni Lasalle kuarang membanggakan sehingga beliau berasa akan berpusas hati sekiranya beliau dapat setakat tamatkan pengajian tiga tahunnya itu.

Namun, tamat dihujung keputusan yang diraih dua tahun kemudian mengubah pandangananya itu.

Meskipun tidak memenuhi harapan tinggi, tak kedua lepas benodik itu masih berjaya meraih ijazah Kepujian Kelas Pertama bagi kursus yang disertayanya itu.

"Memang saya tidak sangka de-ngan keputusannya itu."

"Apakah tidak, Keputusan tahun pertama dan penggal pertama tahun kedua segera 'O.K.-O.K.' sahaja."

"Sehobat itulah apabila dapat kepu-tusan kelar pertama itu, saya terper-panjat," kata Cik Muafah, 24 tahun.

Beliau berkata, selain mendapat dorongan daripada isteri, ternyata ibu ba-punya, Cik Muafah mendapat masing-masing peringkat daripada asatizahnya setiap kali beliau menghadiri kelas ulangan diri.

Pada hari yang sama, dia bersama rapat dengan rakan-rakan sekursusnya turut membantu beliau menyusilaikan diri dengan semua modul yang diambilnya sepanjang peng-jian.

Tekanan yang diberi para guru-nya langsung tidak mematahkan se-mangatnya untuk memberikan yang terbaik dalam setiap pelajarannya.

"Saya tidak pernah simpan rasa marah setiap kali 'ditekan' guru."

"Bagi saya, setiap guru itu ingin-kan yang terbaik daripada pelajar-nya," ujarnya lagi.

Menurutnya, ibu bapanya tidak pernah menyuruh mereka sekeluarga ga ubah cari amalan mereka di sana.

"Yang penting kami terus kekal-

kan jati diri," jelasnya lagi.

Cik Muafah, yang bercerdang me-

nyambung pengajian ke peringkat Sarjana dalam beberapa tahun akan datang telah turut ditawarkan bekerja di sebuah syarikat rekaan dalaman.

First Class Graduates From LASALLE

Mum endeavours to work two jobs to burn laziness

Mr Luqman Nurhakim Abdul Gafor was an unmotivated student while taking a course in Audio Publishing and Digital Video at the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) College West, a few years ago. He often skipped classes until his studies were affected.

However, while undergoing National Service (NS), something sparked a thought in his mind about the sacrifices made by his mother, Mdm Sapiah Nek, to sponsor his schooling.

To this day, Mdm Sapiah still works her two jobs as a housekeeping staff at the National University Hospital (NUH) and a part time worker at the fast food restaurant, McDonald's.

26-year-old Mr Luqman's chest heaves as he remembers his mother working hard just to see him succeed in his studies, career and life.

It was from that moment on that the youngest of two siblings made sure that he never wasted the opportunity to continue his Diploma and undergraduate studies at LASALLE College of the Arts.

After getting a Diploma in Broadcast Media, he was awarded a First Class Honours in Film yesterday.

Mr Luqman got his scroll at LASALLE's 32nd Convocation ceremony which took place in Hall 3 of the Singapore Expo Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The Guest of Honour at the ceremony was Minister for Trade and Industry, Mr Chan Chun Sing.

When he was interviewed by *Gah!* at LASALLE recently, Mr Luqman explained: "In the beginning, I had hopes of going to a Polytechnic." However, after he got his General Certificate of Education (GCE) 'N' Level results, he went straight to ITE. A few of his secondary school teachers were disappointed with his decision.

"At that time, I was lazy at ITE. It was difficult for me to be positive then. Fortunately, while serving NS, I thought about how it was not right for me to waste my time and the opportunity to study. My mum was working so hard at the hospital and fast food restaurant. I have to repay her for all that she has done by focusing on my studies.

"For five years in LASALLE, that is three years for the Diploma and two years for undergraduate studies, I have never been idle or wasted time.

"The cost of my studies at the art institution is also expensive. Luckily, I received help from Mendaki.

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No matter how tired I am, I will still work to complete my projects. I did not easily give up or let the “one-minute spirit” overcome me,” he said.

For his final year, Mr Luqman and a few of his course-mates had to complete two film projects, a short film and a documentary.

Both were out of his comfort zone and touched on taboo topics often hidden from society.

Hiding Birds is a short film about homosexuals. *Pre-Loved* is a documentary that tells the narrative of a girl who was willing to sell her underwear in order to earn a lot of money.

“I faced many challenges as the editor for both films.

“I was in an uncomfortable position. I had to make sure the story-telling came through. There were elements of symbolism in the film and I had to balance that with other aspects so audiences could better digest the storyline.

“Communication is also necessary. Imagine the director deciding to make changes to accommodate the needs of the producer, after a tiring period of editing the film,” adds Mr Luqman.

As of three months ago, he has been hard at work learning about post-production through his job editing videos at an international media service company, TTV Media.

“Film has the role of presenting stories that can spark inspiration or positive steps in an individual. I have matured in my long journey from ITE to Lasalle itself. Most importantly, find your interest and do not give up,” he advised.

Two friends help each other achieve success

CONSIDERING they are both mature students who have work experience, Mr Muhammad Masuri Mazlan and Miss Irmawati Tubi often support each other at LASALLE College of the Arts.

The two friends in fact have ended their studies in the BA(Hons) Fine Arts Programme, with both receiving First Class Honours, the day before yesterday.

Mr Muhammad Masuri, 27, a former Patients’ Services Officer in a local hospital said:

“I am happy and grateful that after going through the trials and tribulations of life, finally I am successful in the field of Fine Arts which I am interested in but never delved into before this.

“All this is possible due to the prayers of those around me, including my teacher who I respect like my own parents.

“Irma and I share the same principles. Even though we are much older than the other students, we are certain that this knowledge will last our whole lives.

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"It is an act of worship that requires sacrifice."

The humorous young man with polite manners has received many golden opportunities producing attractive sculptures or performance art pieces, apart from opportunities to travel to Japan throughout his studies in LASALLE.

He has won multiple awards like the Goh Chok Tong Inspirational Youth Award, Takifuchi International Art Award from Japan and the Winston Oh Travel Award for his excellent art work.

Touching on the Winston Oh Travel Award which includes a grant to carry out art research overseas, he wishes to continue his studies with a Master's degree and said,

"My mind is open as to why the modern Japanese, including the youths, still believe in the myth behind the Star Festival or Tanabata in Tokyo.

"The myth about two lovers (represented by the stars Vega and Altair) who are able to meet only once a year on a clear night has made me more excited. The Japanese write their hopes on small pieces of coloured paper called 'tanzaku'.

"Upon my return to Singapore, I completed a performance art installation step by step regarding this belief in a video format.

"The core message I am trying to present is, if we want something, don't just hope for it without hard work."

Miss Irmawati, 36, an art teacher from Fuhua Secondary School, admits that she has wanted to pursue a degree in Fine Arts since she completed her diploma at the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) some 15 years ago.

Before becoming a teacher, she once worked as a case manager and trainer for a group of special needs adults at the Movement for the Intellectually Disabled of Singapore (MINDS)

She trained them so that they would be able to fit in with the community at large.

"After having left the study hall as a student for so long, I had to get used to carrying the responsibility of learning once more.

"However, I always gave my best and in fact did personalized art projects, whether they were about medical problems of my grandmother or a skin affliction that I had.

"I believe that each work of art can form the basis through which we can reflect upon and educate society," she continued.

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Adult student in Dubai meets unexpected success in Interior Design

Muafah Amran's journey in the BA(Hons) Interior Design Programme at LASALLE College of the Arts was so lacklustre that she would have been satisfied just to complete her three years of studies.

However, unexpectedly, the results she got two years later changed her perspective. Although she did not entertain high hopes, the second of eight children was able to obtain First Class Honours for the course she enrolled in.

"I really did not expect these results. Why not? My first-year results and those of my first term in the second year were just ok. So when I got the First Class results, I was shocked," said Miss Muafah, 24 years old.

According to her, apart from family support, especially from her parents, Miss Muafah also got a lot of good advice and reminders from her religious teachers each time she attended her religious classes.

At the same time, cooperating with her course-mates also helped her to get used to the modules she took throughout her studies.

The pressure she got from her teachers did not break her spirit at all and she gave her best in every lesson. "I never harbored any grudges against my teachers whenever they "tekan" (pressed) me. To me, every teacher wants the best from their students," she added.

What was more encouraging was that the unexpected results were achieved shortly upon her return home four years ago with her family, after having lived for ten years in Dubai and Saudi Arabia. This is because at that time, her father was working as a project engineer for the skyscraper Burj Khalifa in Dubai.

The former Tampines North Primary School student continued her secondary schooling overseas during that time.

However, that has not made the friendly girl lose her Malay mother tongue and culture. In fact, this interview conducted with the reporter proved that she was still fluent in Malay.

This is despite the fact that while studying overseas, English was her first language and she took French as an elective and is the second language that she speaks.

"Even though we had to speak English often, Malay was still the main language we used as a family. Therefore, there was no problem fitting in speaking Malay while mingling with other family members back in Singapore," she said.
