FROM THE DEAN

The LASALLE Show season is an extended opportunity for the Faculty of Performing Arts to present the remarkable talents of students graduating from our programmes in the School of Contemporary Music and the School of Dance and Theatre. In spite of many COVID-19 challenges, the achievements are amazing.

LASALLE offers intensive and demanding training and education at the highest international level. Our musicians, composers, actors, musical theatre performers, dancers and technicians graduate from LASALLE all set to adapt and pivot to a rapidly changing environment. Our students are ready for the world of work, and ready to change the world with their skills, creative thinking and knowledge.

Throughout April, we are showcasing productions by our programmes in BA(Hons) Acting (Marina Carr's adaptation of *Blood Wedding* written in 1932 by Federico García Lorca, directed by Blake Hackler), BA(Hons) Musical Theatre (*Musical Theatre Showcase* 2022, directed by Dayal Singh), Diploma in Dance (*Are We There Yet?* featuring new works by alumni and Young Artist Award winners Yarra lleto and Sufri Juwahir, together with alumnus Muhd Sharul Mohd and up-and-coming choreographers Germaine Cheng and popular street dance duo ScRach MarcS), and Diploma in Performance (Noel Grieg's *Rainbow's Ending* directed by Ross Nasir).

In addition, there are over 60 separate public music recitals for our graduates in Diploma in Music and BA(Hons) Music in pop, jazz, electronic music, compositional and classical piano taking place at LASALLE. This year, the concerts will all be streamed on LASALLE's YouTube channel.



Many of our performances are supported by the exceptional work of final year Diploma students in our Theatre Production and Management and Audio Production programmes.

The team behind the training is drawn from the best teachers and technical team from Singapore and many countries around the world. The faculty has outstanding and acclaimed staff in all the disciplines we offer. This all part of what LASALLE offers in the performing arts.

The LASALLE Show is an excellent showcase for the graduating students and demonstrates how far they have already travelled on their learning journey. Former students are seen in exciting venues and companies in Singapore and overseas. These new graduates are prepared to join them as part of the ever-growing family of practitioners from LASALLE.

FROM THE PROGRAMME LEADER

LASALLE's BA(Hons) Acting programme prepares students for professional careers throughout the industry. From working on stage and screen, to hosting for TV and teaching, our graduates deploy a multifaceted skill set as part of a cross-cultural curriculum. A balance of Asian and Western techniques and approaches frame a pedagogy developing actors through an entrepreneurial ethos.

Tonight you are sharing in our graduation production of Marina Carr's adaptation of Federico García Lorca's *Blood Wedding*. A compelling drama trafficking in love, loss and vengeance, Blake Hackler has steadily guided these students throughout the creative process. As such, they have applied what they have been learning throughout three years of training as part of their culminating effort at LASALLE.

The Acting programme offers numerous opportunities to collaborate with international artists like Blake. Our membership with the esteemed Asia Pacific Bond (APB) of Theatre Schools, a select consortium of the region's most distinguished institutions in our field, demonstrates such an approach. The actors you are seeing tonight have worked alongside their peers from Brazil's Escola de Teatro as well as the Zurich University of the Arts. In June our Level 2 students will be travelling to Perth, where they will spend a week sharing in the training of their counterparts at the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts.

In addition to *Blood Wedding*, this academic year we produced Joel Tan's *People* and Kuo Pao Kun's *Descendants of the Eunuch Admiral*, a pair of local plays that exemplify the programme's Singaporean identity. Moreover, in February we mounted Chay Yew's *A Winter People*, an adaptation of *The Cherry Orchard* set in prerevolutionary China instead of Chekhov's Russia. Yew's play further emphasises our commitment to cross-cultural training within a learning community defined by the values of diversity, equity and inclusion. The students you are seeing tonight represent the programme's commitment to training multifaceted artists. Their national, gender and racial identities are as varied as their professional and creative interests are distinct and nimble. Some have already appeared on Singapore's professional stages and television shows while others are initiating their own projects, shooting films, teaching or preparing for graduate school. We are proud of them all and grateful for you sharing in their work. Enjoy the performance!

ABOUT THE PLAY

Lorca's *Bodas de Sangre (Blood Wedding)* poses a huge challenge to any cast and creative team. How does one reconcile the various styles of the play? Stark naturalism alongside poetic lyricism. High comedy juxtaposed with Euripidean tragedy. Part folk opera, part pastoral, part melodrama, the play's enduring magic is born out of its refusal to be categorised.

Our approach as an ensemble has been to lean into the difference, to highlight the shifts in style allowing each section to be exactly what it is on the page. The designers Petrina Dawn, Adrian Tan, Theresa Chan and Daryl Michael have created a sterile, exposed world where nothing can be hidden, where uniformity stifles and exposes, where any derivation from the norm is seen as an affront. The design requires the acting company be both precise and passionate in equal measure. Everything has meaning - every gesture, breath, gaze, word. The high poeticism of the play demands a deep well of emotional investment. In this world, everything is at stake, always. Life. Death. The eternal wound. Nothing is easy. Lorca's concept of duende rejects "all sweet geometry we understand," instead it "shatters."

I often say that the line between great acting and terrible acting is very thin. What is one person's glory is another's embarrassment, but the commitment, the willingness of an actor to put herself on the line, is necessary to bring this material to life. I've asked this cast to dance on this edge at every rehearsal and they have obliged with grace, willingness and generosity. Any successes are theirs. Any deficits are mine. It has been a rare pleasure to work with this group of extraordinary artists.

LASALLE's Faculty of Performing Arts offers a range of comprehensive undergraduate programmes in Dance, Music, and Theatre. The degree programmes are offered at Honours level and include Acting, Music (Jazz, Popular Music, Classical Music, Composition, Music Technology), and Musical Theatre. In addition, the Faculty offers diplomas in Audio Production, Dance, Music, Performance and Theatre Production and Management.

SCHOOL OF DANCE & THEATRE

Offering BA(Hons) programmes for Acting and Musical Theatre, as well as Diplomas in Dance, Performance, and Theatre Production and Management, the School of Dance & Theatre takes students on a challenging but personal learning journey, nurturing the talent of today into the leading arts practitioners of tomorrow.

With the ability to push the boundaries of performance and production by exploring the fluidity of cultures and disciplines, the School's ethos focuses on contemporary performance, actively engaging with technologies and practices that encourage experimentation. Situated in the hub of rising Asia, students will be exposed to a rich variety of performance cultures from around the region.

During the course of studies, students will learn through rehearsal processes under the direction of LASALLE staff, local and international visiting directors, choreographers and music directors. Students' learning journeys are punctuated by performance opportunities at a range of sites and venues and culminate in performances at the College's professionally-equipped theatre venues, as well as film and recording studios. They can also look forward to gaining real-world experience through the development of new works in conjunction with global industry and community partners.

Upon graduation, not only will students be technically proficient, but also collaborative, critical thinkers capable of working across disciplines, industries and media as artists and entrepreneurs.



BA(HONS) ACTING



Through classes, projects, workshops and productions, the programme develops students' abilities to work in an ensemble environment with awareness of their own imaginative resources. The programme prepares actors for careers on stage and screen, through live and digitally recorded performance opportunities using professional quality facilities and equipment in the College's three theatre venues, film and recording studios.

The programme often collaborates with other disciplines within LASALLE including the Puttnam School of Film & Animation and the School of Contemporary Music; as well as with professional partners particularly in the development of new theatre works. These collaborations offer students a wider perspective on artistic practices across other forms in the industry.

Students participate in a variety of productions directed by both local and international professionals in a range of classic and contemporary works that are innovative, authentic and thought-provoking.





DIPLOMA IN THEATRE PRODUCTION & MANAGEMENT

The Diploma in Theatre Production and Management (formerly Diploma in Technical and Production Management) equips students for employment in the fastgrowing theatre production and management industry. The exciting, practical and diverse curriculum will introduce students to the broad range of subject areas involved in the mounting of theatre and other kinds of live events such as music, corporate and industry shows, cultural events, exhibitions, film and television. Students will be given handson practice working on LASALLE's drama, dance, musical theatre and music shows, which are staged in the College's three fully equipped theatre venues. Students will also have opportunities to contribute to film, videos and other forms of displays, exhibitions and events.

The curriculum allows students to find and explore their own strengths and interests. It also equips students with the skills and practice required to open up career opportunities within the wide range of fields that exist within theatre and event production. Built within the programme curriculum are the transferable skills that will give students the widest possible skill set. Subject areas include production management, lighting, sound, audio visual, stage management, scenic construction, prop making and costume.

Students will be empowered to work both independently and as part of a team. By collaborating on projects and productions with other programmes, students will learn to work with actors, dancers, musicians, visual artists and other technicians in planning and managing complex artistic and communication aspects.
