In addition, there are over 60 exciting, public music recitals for our graduates in Diploma in Music and the BA(Hons) Music in pop, jazz, electronic music, compositional and classical piano taking place at LASALLE. This year, the concerts will all be streamed on LASALLE's YouTube channel.

Many of our performances are supported by the exceptional work of final year Diploma students in our Theatre Production and Management and Audio Production programmes.

The team behind the training is drawn from the best teachers and technical teams from Singapore and many countries around the world. The faculty has outstanding and acclaimed staff in all the disciplines we offer. This is all part of what LASALLE offers in the performing arts.

About the show

A toast to the Diploma in Dance graduating class of 2023 on the versatile dance, performance and choreographic skills that they have amassed over the past three years.

We present a choreographic reflection by the graduands on renegotiating their social space. The performers comment on the recent and distant events that have shaped them in a dance by award-winning choreographer Liu I-Ling (Taiwan). Their sense of presence is further stretched in the work by Young Artist Award recipient and alumnus Zhuo Zihao, while Fairul Zahid and alumna Gianti Giadi draw from a mix of traditional dance and contemporary dance backgrounds to challenge the bounds of their physicality.

From the Programme Leader

I wanted to name this performance *No More*Pandemic Dances. I thought it would be funny. But
more importantly, it captures our current sentiments
in these times and in the performance. We are
sick of talking about the pandemic but we can't
escape the fact that it has changed us.

From disciplined pandemic living to daily dance classes, the impact of our daily practices on who we are is expressed in Liu I-Ling's Normal Life. Liu first worked with our students in 2016 for a Singapore International Festival of the Arts presentation of Bill T Jones' A Letter/Singapore. Six years later, I was delighted to have the chance to invite her to create a group work adapted from her own autobiographical solo performance. The nature of the work is dependent on the personal stories of the cast, so although the two versions were created with the same strategies, they developed differently. It was first seen as a work-in-progress at Esplanade Theatre's da:ns festival.

Allocentric has also gone through several iterations with a few different casts. The moment we could travel in 2022, this work by lecturer Fairul Zahid took the students to New York City for the Battery Dance Festival to have their 'revenge travel' experience.

Shall We Talk? came from the dancers' desire to express the difficulties of communication in their shifting group dynamics when stuck with each other day in and day out. In these situations, if the walls could talk, it might look something like Zhuo Zihao's *The Witness—Merely Observing*.

The restrictions imposed due to COVID-19 robbed many performers of long awaited opportunities and as in Gianti Giadi's work, a lot of us had to give up our dreams and bury them in order to move forward. Because this performance is about celebrating the future while acknowledging the past, we raise a glass and say to the dancers and you—¡SALÚD!, which means 'health' in Spanish. This is a toast to the good things to come and a wish for us all to stay in good health.

Fairul Zahid

Fairul Zahid holds a master's degree (MFA) from New York University, Tisch School of the Arts. He was a principal dancer/choreographer at ASK Dance Company, Christina Noel and the Creature NYC, The Nutcracker New York City Ballet, and LaneCo Arts NYC, as well as an artistic director of Asia Duo Dance Company. He has worked with several local and international choreographers.

Fairul was a lecturer at several universities in Malaysia, including the National Academy of Arts, Culture, and Heritage (ASWARA) and University Technology MARA (UiTM), and is currently a dance lecturer at LASALLE College of the Arts' School of Dance and Theatre. He was also invited to several universities as a guest lecturer/choreographer, including Minzu University, Capital Normal School (Beijing), University of Philippines, and Temple University Philadelphia.

Fairul is a prolific and versatile choreographer/dancer working in the disciplines of contemporary ballet, Malay dance, Chinese classical dance, Indian classical dance and jazz. He has also won local and international awards, including Best Choreographer, Best Group Performance and Best Feature Artist at the Cameronian Arts Award and Yokohama Dance Collection for the MASDANZA prize. He was a recipient of the Royal Arts Gala and Star Scholarship Award by Yayasan Sime Darby Malaysia.

Fairul is currently pursuing his Ph.D. at the University of Malaya (UM) Malaysia, focusing on practice as research in choreography.

Gianti Giadi

Gianti Giadi is a choreographer, a performing artist and the owner of Gigi Art of Dance Studio, Company and Foundation in Jakarta, Indonesia since 2009.

Starting with Indonesian traditional dance when she was four, Gianti continued learning various genres such as Broadway, hip-hop, traditional, contemporary and ballet, eventually graduating with a BA(Hons) Dance from LASALLE College of the Arts, Singapore. She has been teaching for four years and is back this year to choreograph for the Diploma in Dance graduation show.

Gianti won the Most Promising Work and Most Favourite Work awards in 2012 and 2015 respectively as part of Sprouts, a Singaporean choreography competition. Her choreographies have been showcased in different events such as Indonesian singers' concerts, site-specific performances, commercials, contemporary festivals and musicals in Indonesia, Singapore, Philippines, Malaysia, America and Europe.

Gianti's work often explores the theme of human life through storytelling, emotional journey and bodily experience.

Gianti has been teaching for more than 20 years in various genres. She believes that through the performing arts, she can make a positive impact in the community. Gianti is passionate about introducing performing arts to the younger generation as a platform to find their superpower and be the best version of themselves.

Liu I-Ling 劉奕伶

Liu I-Ling is a contemporary dance artist originally from Taiwan, and a former member of Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Company for 11 years.

Liu has been creating choreographies that focus on reminiscence, trauma, social observation and the re-definition of body 'technique'. In 2022, her duet work ... and, or... won the Jury Prize of the Yokohama Dance Collection Competition I. She was one of the recipients of the Cloud Gate Art Makers Project in 2021 and her solo work *Normal Life* was presented in da:ns festival 2022 at the Esplanade Singapore.

In recent years, Liu has also collaborated with visual artists, photographers, composers, directors and actors in theatre and film. Since 2019, she has collaborated with filmmaker Su Hui-Yu and performed The White Waters in New York City, Taipei and Melbourne. Since 2020, she has participated in artist Ming-Wei Lee's work *Our Labyrinth* and performed in the Metropolitan Museum and Tate Modern. In 2022, she was the rehearsal director in the Taiwan version of Australian choreographer Stephanie Lake's work *Colossus*. She is currently a part-time assistant professor at the Taipei University of the Arts.

Zhuo Zihao

Zhuo Zihao is a highly accomplished dance artist with over 23 years of experience in the industry. He is a graduate of the LASALLE-SIA College of the Arts with a Diploma in Dance (2002) and holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts (Honours) in Dance (2008) from the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts. Zihao's career began with Odyssey Dance Theatre from 2000 to 2004 before he co-founded Dance In Situ (DIS) in 2015. He was also a founding member of The Human Expression (T.H.E) Dance Company, where he served from 2008 to 2016 and has maintained an Associate Artist position since. He currently works as an independent dance artist after leaving T.H.E in 2016.

Zihao has received many accolades throughout his career, including the Young Artist Award (Dance) in 2012. He is known for his iconic works, including *Felt.Sense* in 2013, which was created in collaboration with Bani Haykal's sound composition, exploring what trauma feels like by combining 3D video projection and live performers. Another notable piece is *Being* from Dance In Situ in 2016, which was selected by Straits Time Life! as one of the three "Best of The Year" pieces.

In addition to his stage works, Zihao has also been actively involved on digital and social media platforms. In 2020, he produced 10 episodes on dance for the National Arts Council's 'From the Living Room' Facebook series. He also created 'C.R.A.M - The Prologue' in 2021, a research and development project that explores his philosophy and principles on performance, supported by Raw Moves.

Zihao's latest work and performance is *Half*, a collaborative dance film commissioned by Esplanade Theatres by the Bay for Huayi Festival 2022. The film was conceptualised and directed by award-winning Royston Tan, with music by Chong Li-Chuan, and co-choreography by Yarra lleto and Zihao himself.

Overall, Zhuo Zihao is a visionary dance artist who continues to push boundaries in the industry with his innovative and thought-provoking works.

Alden Wong (Aldie)



Amanda Tan Jia Chian



Bella Neo



Dibyaani Rath



Evelyn An



Jocelyn Tay



Kang Minchae



Natasha Koo





The close guidance of lecturers, a supportive environment and many performance opportunities provided by this holistic programme will help students develop into a versatile performer in a range of artistic and commercial dance contexts—highly sought-after as a dancer, dance teacher and choreographer and well prepared for further study.

An international faculty of lecturers and guest artists will teach a diverse range of dance techniques: Street Dance, Jazz, Ballet and Contemporary Dance. Over three years, students will focus on techniques and styles decided through negotiation with lecturers. Allied classes will also improve technical proficiency, strength, expressive range and versatility in performance. The classes also include somatic based approaches, performance techniques and Asian movement practices.

Strength in creativity and performance is further enhanced through choreography, improvisation classes and a range of exciting choreography and cross-disciplinary projects with renowned arts venues and institutions. These may be augmented with a variety of theatrical and acting techniques such as Viewpoints, Dance Improvisation, Contact Work, Mask Work and Animal Work. Exposure to these many techniques will help students to be a more expressive and multidisciplinary performer. This is supported by performance opportunities in multiple performance venues, styles and situations.

Employability is further enhanced through exposure to dance pedagogy, career paths and options, audition techniques and the local industry. Critical thinking and self-reflexivity is part of the training at every level.
