

Performed by the BA(Hons) Acting students, the play is set in the home of a wealthy Russian merchant 25 years before the revolution in 1917. A black comedy taking place in domestic environs, the play explores unchecked greed in the context of a family jockeying to become the heir of a dying patriarch. The titular character is the master of the family in her husband's absence, as he is terminally ill and deteriorating out of sight. The play is a mix of comedy and conniving cunning, especially demonstrated by Vassa, who is driven to comic extremes to get what she wants. Bartlett's dark adaptation of Maxim Gorky's 19th century tragicomedy is as smart as it is poignant yet as silly as it can engender pathos.

Mother Courage and Her Children was written in 1939 in response to the rise in fascism and Nazism in Germany. Brecht chose to locate this story in the 17th century's Thirty Years' War and it follows the fortunes of Anna Frieling and her three children. Determined to create opportunity out of crisis, Anna's efforts ultimately prove fruitless and lead to the loss of all her children. The play serves as a moral compass for anyone who seeks to benefit from calamity and suffering. Ma Courage takes loose inspiration from Brecht's original, relocating the play and its concerns to a Singaporean context. Performed by the Diploma in Performance students in collaboration with the Diploma in Theatre Production and Management programme.


- Thich Nhat Hanh (in Srinivasnan, 2010, pp. 127)
